FAITH & HOPE DOG RESCUE

Giving Hope to Homeless Dogs of South Texas

Meet Maddie, a young street pup who was found in dire condition- very pregnant and very near death. Unbeknownst to anyone, seven of her puppies had died inside her and sepsis would've consumed them all, including her, had she not been rescued. Enter Faith and Hope Dog Rescue.

Lucky for Maddie, she and her remaining three puppies were saved through an emergency c-section on New Year's Day and we became their foster family. While Maddie's puppies have found their fur-ever homes, she continues to wait for her adoption day.

Co-founded by Islander, Karen Cowen in 2016, Faith and Hope has adopted out over 500 animals. But they can only rescue dogs from the streets and kill shelters if they have safe homes to place them in, making fosters the heart of this organization. Once they're placed, Faith and Hope completely vets the pups which includes vaccinations, spay/neuter, microchip, and address any illness/injuries. Vet bills can quickly run up into the thousands of dollars (as was the case with Maddie's emergency c-section.) This is why fundraising like what we do through the PIPHC is so important.

Their biggest expenses are vetting, so monetary contributions are very important, but you can also:

- Foster- There are only 55 fosters for the 67 dogs currently active in the rescue, with more turned away daily due to lack of fosters. Please consider opening your heart and home to be a foster to a deserving pup who is waiting for their fur-ever home. Faith and Hope provides all the food, supplies and vetting. Become a Foster Faith & Hope Foundation Inc.
- Volunteer- They're a 100% volunteer-based organization and your time and talents can save lives! From social media, to grant writing and fundraising, there's always a need for help.
 Volunteer — Faith & Hope Foundation Inc.
- Donate supplies- They're a 100% donation-based organization.
 - Purina One Dog and Purina One Puppy Chow and cans (HEB has a 50% off in-app coupon!)
 - Large & XL puppy potty pads
 - Large & XL wire crates and kennels (gently used is also appreciated)
 - Toys safe for puppies
 - Additional items are on their wish lists <u>Amazon.com</u>

With no overhead costs, 100% of your donation goes directly to the care and well-being of the dogs. By donating, you help <u>Faith and Hope Dog Rescue</u> give these dogs the chance they deserve to live in a home filled with trust, patience, and love. Faith and Hope Dog Rescue is about just that, faith in people's capacity to care and hope for a better future for stray animals.

DID YOU KNOW?

VOLUNTEER HOURS

Parrot Heads in Paradise (PHiP) is the organization with the purpose of overseeing and promoting the international network of Parrot Head Clubs as a humanitarian group sharing information and social activities for mutual benefit. Within this effort, Clubs report their accomplishments throughout the year about charitable organizations that have been supported through collections, volunteer hours, service projects and monetary donations.

What counts? What doesn't count?

Per the PHIP Club Leaders Manual: Man hours are simply the number of club members participating in an event times the number of hours in the event.

For example: 25 club members march in a community Independence Day parade that lasts four hours—25 members X 4 hours per member = 100-man hours.

- The time spent by club members to build a float for this parade should also be tracked. Attendance at a club hosted event does not count.
- If your club hosts a fundraising party, for example, with raffles, auctions, etc. and 300 people show up for the four-hour soiree, you cannot claim 1200 man hours, even through you raised money for a worthy cause.
- However, the dollars raised during the festivities may certainly be claimed as a charitable donation, as can any man hours spent in planning the function, setting up, tearing down, cleaning up, etc.

Our PIPHC of CC is developing systematic methods to collect and tabulate this info for reporting to PHiP. We have in place on our Website, a self-reporting method. Go to the website to report your hours regularly.

Examples of things that count:

- Participating in a community event as a club:
 - Parades
 - o Alzheimer's walks
 - Cancer walks
 - Assisting with nursing home or group home events or parties
 - o Collections of toys, time spent gift wrapping for groups, delivery time
 - Roadside clean-up
- Planning club events:
 - Planning meetings
 - Set up
 - Tear down/Clean up
 - Seeking Sponsorship
 - Time spent seeking sponsors for club events
 - o Time spent seeking donations from businesses for club events

Examples of things that do not count:

- Attending club events going to Happy Hours or attending a club sponsored event
- Individual members volunteering at non-club sanctioned activities
- Monetizing volunteer hours
